1. Business Watch

- Recirculate the Business Watch survey to all DLBA members to promote the program and gauge interest in participation.(it was noted that the pilot project is being expanded to include all ~600 DLBA members, not just the businesses on the one-way section of Fraser Highway)
- Establish one key message to attract interest from businesses to participate in the program
- Create a tri-fold brochure and a more in-depth information package for distribution to participating businesses.
- Full implementation of the BW program.

The following was also noted:

- Consideration be given to create an online application for businesses that wish to participate in the program.

An update is expected at the next meeting regarding the one-page program information circular.

It was noted that there are no information boards in Douglas park, Linwood park and downtown Langley. Consideration could be given to setting up information boards for this purpose.

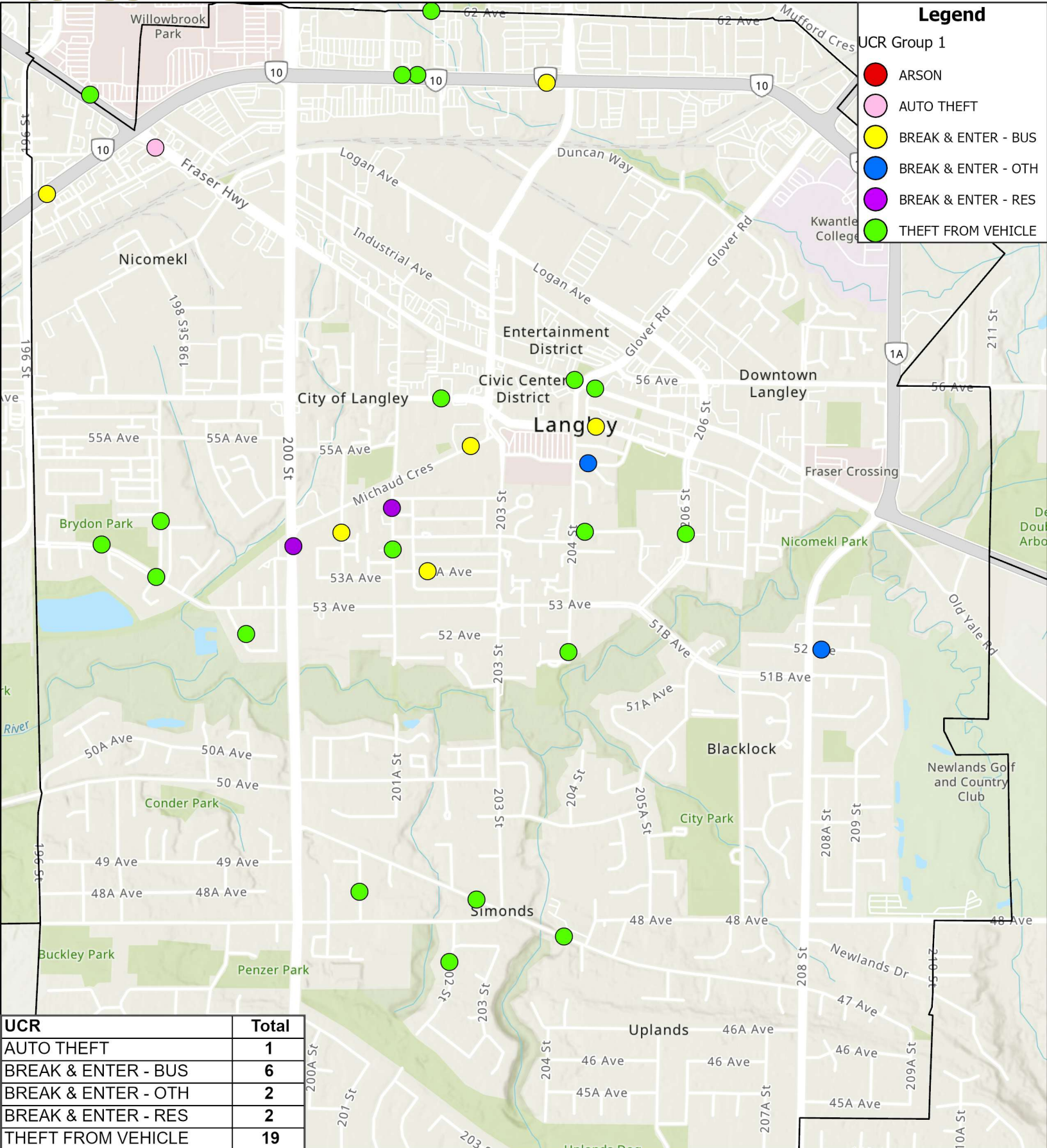

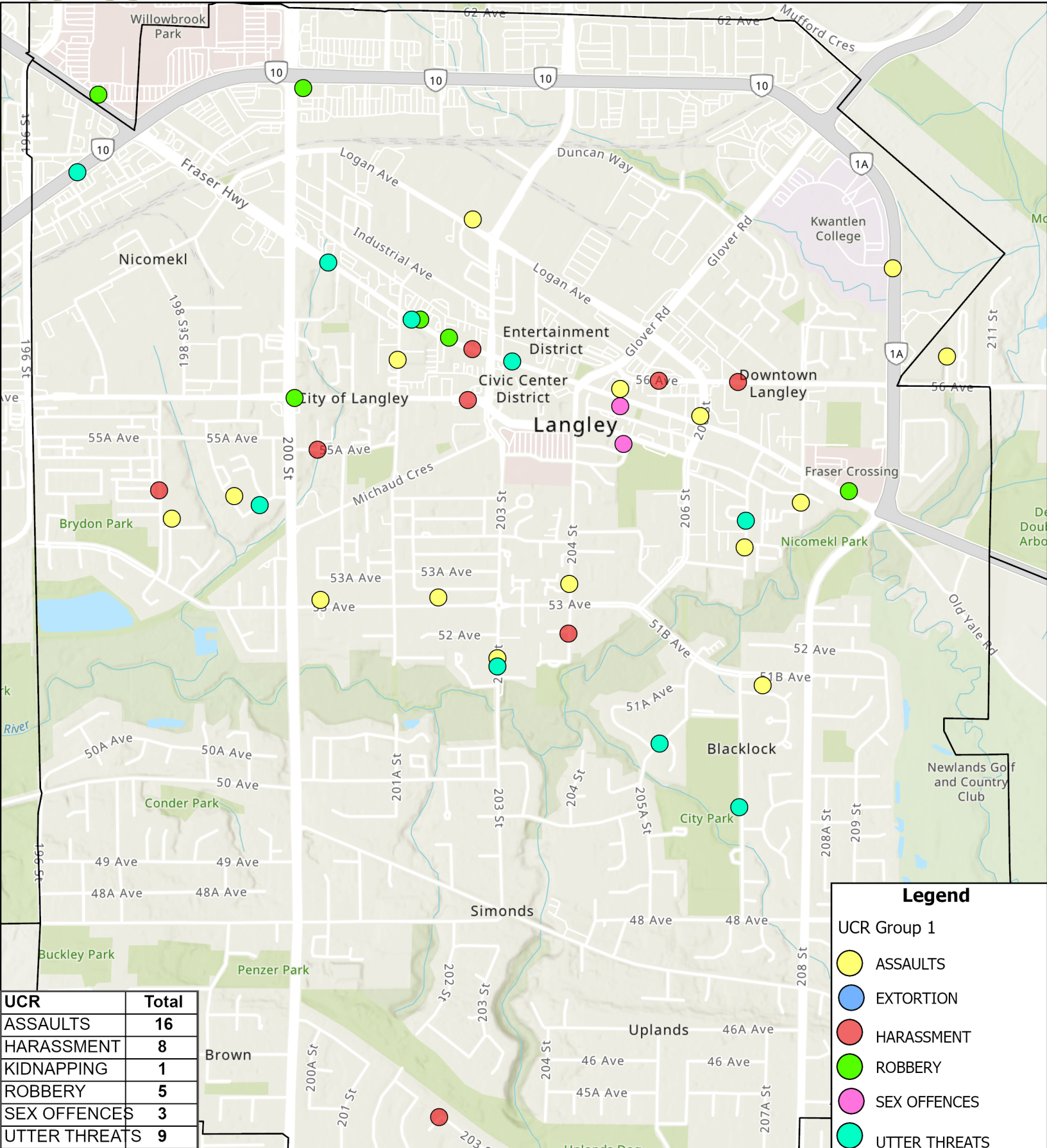
