### 3. **PRESENTATION**

Kim Hilton, Director of Recreation, Culture and Community Services, shared a PowerPoint presentation on Invest Langley City which is a communication platform that the city is promoting to engage community members in their interest to fund an expanded Al Anderson Memorial Pool and/or a performing arts centre as these facilities are currently unfunded.

The goal of this engagement is to determine if this is something the community is interested in and agreeable to pay for the Want to find out if this is something the community is interested in moving forward with one, or both, of these projects, and agreeable to funding them.

### 4. **FOR DISCUSSION**

#### a) Douglas Park Washroom Mural.

The Director of Recreation, Culture and Community Services, shared the Call for Artists for the mural highlighting that we are looking for an artist collective to collaborate on the design, and that artwork illustrates the history of the park, the diversity of the park users, and the events and activities that take place there. The committed specified that an artist collective be a minimum of two artists and that the artists are to collaborate on a cohesive design.

A discussion on the artist fee transpired, as well as a request to reach out the Douglas Park Pickleball Club to see if they are interested in contributing to the cost of the mural.

There is currently \$46,000.00 in the public art fund and this fund does receive an annual contribution of between \$5,000 and \$10,000.

THAT the Arts, Recreation, Culture and Heritage Committee recommend that council approve a fee of \$12,000.00 which includes artists fees and supplies, for the design and construction of a mural on the Douglas Park outdoor washroom illustrating the history of the park, the diversity of park users, and the events and activities that take place there.

Lower Fraser Valley Aboriginal Society is hosting a march for MMIWG at Douglas Park Spirit Stage on May 5<sup>th</sup> from 11am to 1pm.

Langley Community Music School continues to support music education in the community by offering a free Tunes for Tots program on May 5<sup>th</sup>, an Open House on May 9<sup>th</sup> from 2pm-4pm and awarding scholarships such as the recent Young Composers' competition where three scholarships were awarded.
