

Are you eligible to vote in the 2026 General Local Election for Mayor, Councillors, and School Trustees?

Langley City uses the Provincial Voters List from Elections BC. If you voted in a previous provincial or federal election, you are likely on the list. If you are not sure whether you are on the Provincial Voters List, you can find out by emailing pkusack@langleycity.ca, calling 604-514-4585, or by visiting the Administration Department at Langley City Hall, 20399 Douglas Crescent, 2nd Floor, during regular office hours, Monday to Friday 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. (excluding holidays).

Resident electors can register online at elections.bc.ca. Advance elector registrations for resident and non-resident property electors will be accepted at the Administration Department until August 25, 2026. Except for registration at time of voting, elector registrations will not be accepted during the period of August 26 to October 17, 2026.

ELECTOR QUALIFICATIONS**RESIDENT ELECTORS:**

- 18 years of age or older on general voting day (October 17, 2026); and
- a Canadian citizen; and
- a resident of British Columbia for at least 6 months immediately before the day of registration; and
- a resident of the City of Langley; and
- not disqualified under the *Local Government Act* or any other enactment from voting in an election or assent voting and not otherwise disqualified by law.

NON-RESIDENT PROPERTY ELECTORS:

- 18 years of age or older on general voting day (October 17, 2026); and
- a Canadian citizen; and
- a resident of British Columbia for at least 6 months immediately before the day of registration; and
- a registered owner of real property in the City of Langley for at least 30 days immediately before the day of registration; and
- the only persons who are registered owners of the property, either as joint tenants or tenants in common, are individuals who are not holding the property in trust for a corporation or another trust; and
- not entitled to register as a resident elector; and
- not disqualified under the *Local Government Act* or any other enactment from voting in an election or assent voting and not otherwise disqualified by law; and
- **if there is more than one registered owner of the property, only one of those individuals may, with the written consent of the majority of the owners, register as a non-resident property elector.**

MAIL BALLOT VOTING

Qualified electors have the option to apply to vote for Mayor, Councillors, and City of Langley School Trustees by mail ballot.

To obtain a mail ballot, submit a completed Application to Vote by Mail form to the Chief Election Officer - *by September 29 if you plan to have the package mailed to you and returned to Langley City Hall by mail, or by October 16 if you plan to pick up the package in-person*. The application form is available on the City's webpage at langleycity.ca/election or can be requested from the Administration Department by emailing pkusack@langleycity.ca or by calling 604-514-4585.

Nomination forms will be available at Langley City Hall, Administration Department between 8:30 am and 4:30 pm, Monday to Friday, excluding holidays, beginning August 4, 2026, until the close of the nomination period at 4:00 pm on September 11, 2026. Forms are also available online for download at langleycity.ca/election.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR OFFICE

A person is qualified to be nominated, elected, and to hold office as a member of local government if they meet ALL the following criteria:

- Canadian citizen;
- 18 years of age or older on general voting day (October 17, 2026);
- resident of British Columbia for at least 6 months immediately before the day nomination papers are filed; and
- not disqualified under the *Local Government Act* or *School Act* or any other enactment from being nominated for, being elected to or holding the office, or be otherwise disqualified by law.

CAMPAIGN PERIOD EXPENSE LIMITS

In accordance with the *Local Elections Campaign Financing Act*, for the 2026 general local election, the following expense limits for candidates during the campaign period apply (September 19, 2026 to October 17, 2026):

Mayor – \$32,342.77

Councillor – \$16,297.36

Board of Education Trustee (Trustee Electoral Area 2) – \$16,240.08

THIRD PARTY ADVERTISING LIMITS

Directed Advertising Expense limits are specific to an election area and apply to advertising about a candidate or elector organization.

In accordance with the *Local Elections Campaign Financing Act*, for the 2026 general local elections, the following third party advertising limits apply:

Mayor or Councillor – \$1,617.14

Board of Education Trustee (Trustee Electoral Area 2) – \$1,000.70

AVAILABILITY OF LIST OF REGISTERED ELECTORS

Beginning September 1, 2026, until the close of general voting for the election on October 17, 2026, a copy of the list of registered electors will be available for public inspection, at Langley City Hall, Administration Department, 2nd floor, 20399 Douglas Crescent during regular office hours, Monday to Friday, excluding statutory holidays. Before inspecting the list, a person must sign a statement that they will not inspect the list or use the information included in the list except for the purposes of Part 3 – Electors and Elections of the *Local Government Act*.

REQUEST TO OMIT OR OBSCURE

An elector may request that their address or other personal information about them be omitted from or obscured on the list of electors. The elector must contact the Chief Election Officer or the Deputy Election Officer to make this request by August 25, 2026 at 4:30 pm.

OBJECTION TO REGISTRATION OF AN ELECTOR

An objection to the registration of a person whose name appears on the list of registered electors may be made in accordance with the *Local Government Act* until 4:00 pm on September 11, 2026. An objection must be in writing and may only be made by a person entitled to be registered as an elector of the City of Langley and can only be made on the basis that a person whose name appears on the list of electors has died or that a person whose name appears on the list of electors is not qualified to be registered as an elector of the City of Langley.

AVAILABILITY OF LIST OF ELECTORS APPLYING TO VOTE BY MAIL

A list of the electors who apply to vote by mail will be maintained by the Chief Election Officer. Beginning September 1, 2026, until the close of general voting on October 17, 2026, a copy of the list of electors that applied to vote by mail will be available for public inspection at Langley City Hall, Administration Department, 2nd floor, 20399 Douglas Crescent, during regular office hours, Monday to Friday, excluding statutory holidays. Before inspecting the list, a person must sign a statement that they will not inspect the list or use the information included in the list except for the purposes of Part 3 – Electors and Elections of the *Local Government Act*.

OBJECTION TO REGISTRATION OF AN ELECTOR APPLYING TO VOTE BY MAIL

An objection to the registration of a person whose name appears on the list of electors who have applied to vote by mail may be made in accordance with the *Local Government Act* until 4:30 pm on October 16, 2026. An objection may only be made by a person entitled to be registered as an elector of the City of Langley, or a candidate representative, or an election official and can only be made on the basis that a person whose name appears is not entitled to vote or has contravened section 161(3) of the *Local Government Act* (accepting inducements).
