3) **FOR DISCUSSION**

- a) Update on the Innovation District Brand Discovery Session - Chris Rynic, Principal, Rynic

Mr. Rynic provided a PowerPoint presentation providing information to committee members on learnings from the brand discovery session he facilitated at the Food Tech Forum on September 23, 2025, with respect to developing a new foodtech brand.

The PowerPoint presentation will be forwarded to committee members requesting feedback on specific aspects of the Innovation District Brand Discovery process within a set deadline.

- b) Update on Foodtech working group – Wendy Dupley, Economic Development Advisor

Ms. Dupley provided an update on work of the Foodtech working group, which has been meeting monthly since March, and will be providing an end-of-year report for the committee identifying next steps and recommendations for the working group in 2026.

- c) Citizens' Assembly Process Update and Next Steps – Dena Kae Beno, Manager of Social Planning Services and Strategic Initiatives

Ms. Beno provided an update on the preparation of the Citizens' Assembly's final report and timeline for its presentation to Council for endorsement of its recommendations and subsequent presentation to the public.

- d) 2025 Village Café Series Update and Upcoming Final Event – Dena Kae Beno, Manager of Social Planning Services and Strategic Initiatives

Ms. Beno provided an update on events held as part of the 2025 Village Café series, which focused on community safety and wellbeing; and advised of the final event taking place on December 6 in recognition of National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women.

- e) 2026 Village Café Series Calendar and Social, Cultural and Economic Development Focus – Dena Kae Beno, Manager of Social Planning Services and Strategic Initiatives

Ms. Beno provided an update on the 2026 Village Café Series Calendar of events and the focus on social, cultural and economic development activities.

- f) Defining Langley City's Food System through a Food Asset, Equity, and Policy Lens through a Collaborative, Community Development Approach – Dena Kae Beno, Manager of Social Planning Services and Strategic Initiatives

Ms. Beno provided information on the City's receipt of a grant under Plan H Healthy Communities grant program, which is administered by BC Healthy Communities (BCHC) and funded by the Ministry of Health which will be used to conduct a food asset inventory in the City of Langley, the results of which will help inform other food initiatives.

- g) REACT - Now Digital Application Roll-Out – Dena Kae Beno, Manager of Social Planning Services and Strategic Initiatives

Ms. Beno provided information on REACT, a digital health platform designed to prevent drug poisonings and overdose deaths that the City and the Engaged Canadian Communities Society (ECCS) will be testing after receiving funding from Health Canada for this initiative.
